1. Check basic eligibility requirements for financial aid: Start by reviewing and understanding the basic eligibility criteria for federal financial aid. At minimum, you must

- ❖ Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen (including a U.S. national or permanent resident) and have a valid Social Security number.
- ❖ Have a high school diploma or GED certificate.
- ❖ Be enrolled or accepted as a student in an eligible degree or certificate program.

2. Submit the FAFSA

- ❖ To receive any type of federal financial aid, you must next file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid, known as the FAFSA. You'll provide details about your financial situation and family circumstances to verify your need and eligibility for financial aid.

3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress—An SAP may require you to:

- ❖ Earn a minimum GPA.
- ❖ Receive a certain percentage of attempted credits.
- ❖ Stay on track to complete your degree within a specified time frame.

4. Demonstrate financial need—The Office of Federal Student Aid uses the information from your FAFSA to determine your financial need, or how much aid — and what types — you'll receive. Your financial need is calculated by subtracting your EFC from your school's cost of attendance. If you qualify, you might receive need-based aid such as:

- ❖ **Federal Pell Grants:** This aid helps cover educational costs for students who demonstrate "exceptional financial need" and don't already have a bachelor's or professional degree. Pell Grants range up to \$6,195 for 2019 to 2020, and they don't need to be repaid. Terms may apply.
- ❖ **Federal work-study:** This program subsidizes eligible students' wages at part-time jobs with federal funds, generally at jobs related to the student's course of study or in the public interest. Work-study aid does not need to be repaid and may be used as the student chooses.
- ❖ **Subsidized direct loans:** These federal loans must be repaid, but the interest is subsidized by the government while you're in school, during your six-month grace period after leaving school or during periods of loan deferment.

- ✦ Complete your online application for admission. This can be the University of Pittsburgh Application, the Common Application, or the Coalition Application—we accept all three and do not prefer one over the other.
- ✦ Pay your \$55 application fee
- ✦ Submit your Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR). Completing the SRAR is easy—just fill it out to match your transcript exactly.
- ✦ Submit your Official SAT or ACT results (if applicable). We will take your highest ACT composite score and your highest SAT super-score. We do not require the SAT Essay or ACT Writing scores.

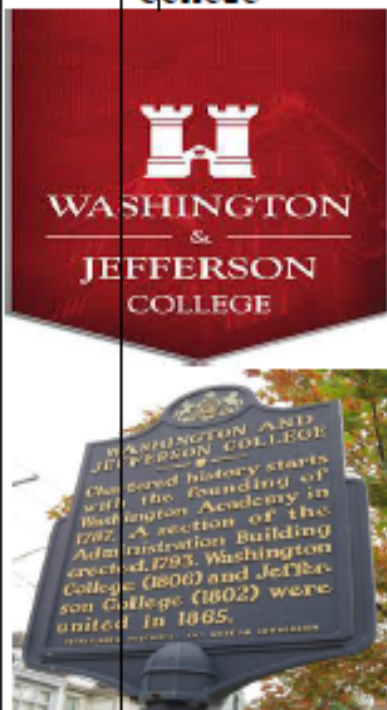

11**Washington & Jefferson College**

Freshman Admission Criteria: Washington & Jefferson College takes a holistic approach to evaluating applications for admission, weighing each of the individual components in the following order:

- **High School Performance**—An applicant's high school grade point average and class rank (if available) will be considered in the context of the rigor of their chosen curriculum and the Admission Committee will look for a minimum course distribution on a student's transcript. If offered, the Admission Committee views strong performance in Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and College in High School courses favorably. Credit is typically awarded for AP scores of 4 or 5, IB (HL) exam scores of 5, and is considered for three or four credit college courses taken in high school.
- **Test Scores**—Standardized test scores are only one factor in our admission process and serve to affirm a student's academic potential in conjunction with their high school performance.
- **Cc-Curricular Involvement and Accomplishments**—W&J Presidents take an active role in their experience inside and outside the classroom. We expect candidates for admission to do the same and demonstrate a strong commitment to school or community activities that match their passions.
- **Meeting with an Admission Counselor**—Candidates are encouraged, but not required, to meet with an admission counselor.
- **Personal Statement (optional)**—The personal statement provides insight into an applicant that cannot be learned from any other document a student submits. It should be approximately 250-500 words, well-written, and tell a story that is distinct to that student.
- **Recommendation (optional)**—One recommendation from a teacher or high school counselor is recommended.

- ⑩ We strongly recommend that you apply for admission by the end of the first semester of your senior year in high school to receive full consideration for admission, scholarships and all other forms of financial aid. Carlow offers different procedures for traditional first-year student admission.

Students applying for admission should:

- ⑩ Arrange for a personal interview and campus visit. Although this is optional, it is strongly recommended, and in some instances, may be required. Admissions counselors are available to help with all steps of admissions and financial aid processes. In many geographical regions, admissions counselors will visit prospective students and their families at their high school or in the neighborhood at a coffee shop or other similar setting;
- ⑩ Submit a completed application form by applying online for free;

13**Penn State University****Freshman Requirements & Application**

- The most important piece of our review is your academic record, which represents your individual four years of academic development. Penn State's assessment of application materials includes the academic courses, grades and levels of those courses and standardized test scores (optional for summer/fall 2021), plus additional factors that may include an audition, a portfolio review, the geographic and cultural background of the student, the personal statement, and the activities list.
- We take a hard look at the many roles you serve as a student, sibling, athlete, son or daughter, volunteer, and/or employee.
- Students applying for admission to Penn State for the summer or fall 2021 terms will have the option of having SAT/ACT scores included in their evaluation for admission.
- SRAR is short for Self-Reported Academic Record, an initiative to ultimately have all future undergraduate applicants to the University submit their high school record as part of the application process, rather than having the school counselors send transcripts for each applicant.

Fee Incurred: There is a \$65.00 application fee—Students can utilize SAT/ACT fee waivers to cover this cost.
