Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

5 SIMPLE STEPS TO UNZIP THAT INFORMATION INTO YOUR FAFSA FORM

HOW TO UNZIP THAT INFORMATION INTO YOUR FAFSA FORM
1. Gather up the information you need to fill out the FAFSA form.
2. Fill out the FAFSA form.
3. Review the FAFSA form for accuracy.
4. Sign the FAFSA form.
5. Submit the FAFSA form.
Your school's financial aid office will use the information from your FAFSA form to determine your financial aid.

1. Check basic eligibility requirements for financial aid:

- Start by reviewing and understanding the basic eligibility criteria for federal financial aid. At minimum, you must
 - Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen (including a U.S. national or permanent resident) and have a valid Social Security number.
 - Have a high school diploma or GED certificate.
 - Be enrolled or accepted as a student in an eligible degree or certificate program.

2. Submit the FAFSA

- To receive any type of federal financial aid, you must next file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid, known as the FAFSA. You'll provide details about your financial situation and family circumstances to verify your need and eligibility for financial aid.

3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress—An SAP may require you to:

- Earn a minimum GPA.
- Receive a certain percentage of attempted credits.
- Stay on track to complete your degree within a specified time frame.

4. Demonstrate financial need—The Office of Federal Student Aid uses the information from your FAFSA to determine your financial need, or how much aid — and what types — you'll receive. Your financial need is calculated by subtracting your EFC from your school's cost of attendance. If you qualify, you might receive need-based aid such as:

- Federal Pell Grants:** This aid helps cover educational costs for students who demonstrate "exceptional financial need" and don't already have a bachelor's or professional degree. Pell Grants range up to \$6,195 for 2019 to 2020, and they don't need to be repaid. Terms may apply.
- Federal work-study:** This program subsidizes eligible students' wages at part-time jobs with federal funds, generally at jobs related to the student's course of study or in the public interest. Work-study aid does not need to be repaid and may be used as the student chooses.
- Subsidized direct loans:** These federal loans must be repaid, but the interest is subsidized by the government while you're in school, during your six-month grace period after leaving school or during periods of loan deferment.
