Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

1. Check basic eligibility requirements for financial aid: Start by reviewing and understanding the basic eligibility criteria for federal financial aid. At minimum, you must

- Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible noncitizen (including a U.S. national or permanent resident) and have a valid Social Security number.
- Have a high school diploma or GED certificate.
- Be enrolled or accepted as a student in an eligible degree or certificate program.

2. Submit the FAFSA

- To receive any type of federal financial aid, you must next file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid, known as the FAFSA. You'll provide details about your financial situation and family circumstances to verify your need and eligibility for financial aid.

3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress—An SAP may require you to:

- Earn a minimum GPA.
- Receive a certain percentage of attempted credits.
- Stay on track to complete your degree within a specified time frame.

4. Demonstrate financial need—The Office of Federal Student Aid uses the information from your FAFSA to determine your financial need, or how much aid — and what types — you'll receive. Your financial need is calculated by subtracting your EFC from your school's cost of attendance. If you qualify, you might receive need-based aid such as:

- Federal Pell Grants:** This aid helps cover educational costs for students who demonstrate "exceptional financial need" and don't already have a bachelor's or professional degree. Pell Grants range up to \$6,195 for 2019 to 2020, and they don't need to be repaid. Terms may apply.
- Federal work-study:** This program subsidizes eligible students' wages at part-time jobs with federal funds, generally at jobs related to the student's course of study or in the public interest. Work-study aid does not need to be repaid and may be used as the student chooses.
- Subsidized direct loans:** These federal loans must be repaid, but the interest is subsidized by the government while you're in school, during your six-month grace period after leaving school or during periods of loan deferment.

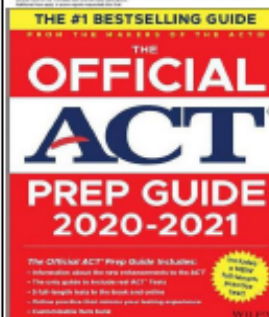

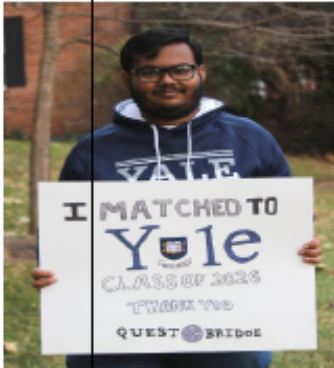

Quest Bridge College Match Scholarship



Eligibility Requirements:

Class Year Eligibility—In order to be eligible to apply to the National College Match in the fall of 2023, applicants must graduate from high school during or before the summer of 2023 and plan to enroll as a first-year student in college in the Fall of 2023.

Academic Criteria

Grades and rigor of high school curriculum

Primarily A's in the most challenging courses available (usually including Honors, AP, and/or IB level courses).

Class rank

Top 5-10% of graduating class.

Standardized test scores
(if taken)

SAT score >1260
ACT composite score >27



We encourage students to report any SAT, ACT, AP, IB, TOEFL, or SAT Subject Test scores available.

Please note that test scores are not required to apply, and around 50% of QuestBridge applicants in the past year did not have test scores. All applications are reviewed holistically, so students who have not taken standardized tests can still be selected as Finalists; however, they should ensure they meet the [standardized testing requirements](#) for each college partner they're interested in.

Additional criteria

Evidence of strong writing ability, intellectual spark, and determination.

Financial Qualifications

Finalists typically come from households earning less than \$65,000 annually for a typical family of four and have minimal assets. This is not a strict cut-off and we encourage students who feel they have faced significant financial hardship to review these financial criteria carefully to see if they may qualify.

Personal Circumstances

Parents' level of education

76% of Finalists are among the first generation in their family to attend a four-year college in the U.S.

Activities, including home or family responsibilities

Participation in extracurricular, community, or other activities. *Activities may include home or family responsibilities, such as part-time jobs to help pay bills, or caring for siblings if parents are absent or at work.*

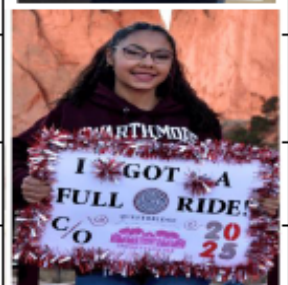
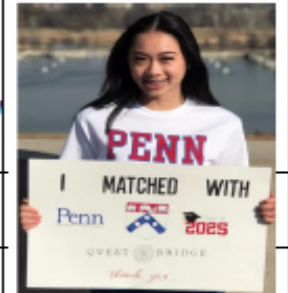
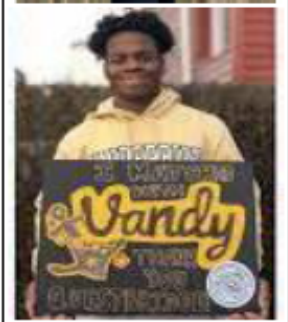
